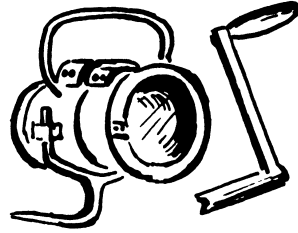
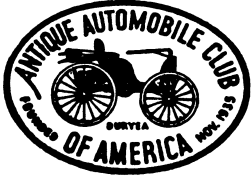

REPORT ON CHURCH TOUR

On a beautiful Sunday morning, June 20th 16 Ontelaunee Indians met at St. John's UCC in Fogelsville for coffee and donuts before the service. Pastor Janet's message was "Fear or Faith". She had a very nice litany for Father's Day. Children's message was the story of David and Goliath "Fear and Faith".

Marilyn and Ray took us to the Starlight diner for lunch (or breakfast) whichever you preferred. (Omelets, burgers, salads) The conversations were just as varied. Lantern flies, grass mowing, vacations, vegetable gardens, grandchildren and Das Awkscht Fescht. I was surprised to see Phyllis walking so well. Great job. "Nice to see everyone enjoying themselves".

With full bellies we head to Grim's Orchards and Family Farm in Breinigsville. Started as 17 acres purchased by Floyd and Bertha Reichert in 1939. Growing feed corn, wheat, barley and oats. Raising over 3,000 chickens and planting a one-acre garden. Over the years they purchased additional parcels of land, which now add up to 114 acres. They had one daughter who married Joshua Dale Grim. They had 2 children; the son now runs the pick your own business.

In 1973 they built a small greenhouse to provide plants for their own 1 acre garden. Growing too much for their own use, they started retailing and wholesaling plants and vegetables. Over the next 16 years they added more greenhouses.

In 1989, Josh along with his parents opened Grim's Greenhouse and Farm Market Inc; which consists of 9 greenhouses for spring bedding plants, hanging baskets and vegetables

plants. They farmed 80 acres of vegetables, sweetcorn and grew 25,000 mums. Then in 1997 they added the first corn maze in the Leigh Valley region; (it was an 8-acre maze) which included pick your own pumpkin patch, straw maze, corn boxes and other activities.

In 2011 they started a dwarf pick your own apple orchard on a trellis system, with over 20 varieties. Added an irrigation system, an 8-foot-high deer fence, and planted sugar and red sunset maples for fall color. Apple trees produce for at least 20 years. Then the next year they started giving hayrides tours of the farm.

In 2013 they planted 2,500 sweet and sour cherry trees; available for picking in June and July. After planting cherry trees, it takes 3 to 4 years to produce; 7 years to full maturity. They produce 25 to 30 years. Also planted 30,000 strawberry plants, for May and June picking. After 2 years strawberry yield is dramatically reduced.

In 2020 more changes; potatoes, sweet potatoes and many varieties of vegetables. After gathering your potatoes, they will wash, cut and deep fry them for you. Any fruit and vegetables unpicked by customers will be gathered and processed to be sold in their store along with food and drink. They also make apple cider. There are 50 bee hives on the property for pollinating.

Owner Josh Grim was our tour guide. He explained how owning an orchard is a full-time, year-round job.
