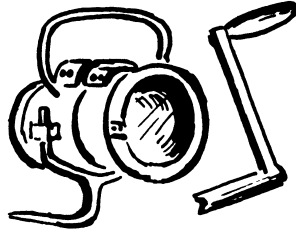
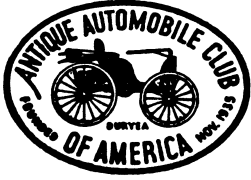

NOTICE

For those wishing to follow to Shenandoah, meet at 8:15 AM at the Tower Health Medical Center off of Rt.61. Take Route I-78 to Rt. 61 North. Go to light at Jetson Dr. & Cabella Drive. Turn right onto Jetson drive and go one block and bear right onto Industrial Dr. The medical center is on the right just before the Cracker Barrel. Shenandoah is approximately ½ hour from Cabellas.

REPORT ON THE 4 DAY TOUR

The tour of Cape May, N.J. was hosted by Ken and Elsa Dages. Twenty five club members participated with 11 cars. The only classic car was Lester's cadillac. The weather cooperated with sunny days in the 80's. We stayed at the Hampton Inn in Egg Harbor. On Friday morning everyone met at the Hellertown Diner for an early breakfast. Unfortunately the person who booked the reservations never scheduled us in the computer. So the waiter and the cook had to scramble to serve our large group. After an hour + late start we hit the road. The tour did not use the interstates. We drove on many 2 lane roads, through small Jersey towns, and along the Pine barrens. On Friday we toured the Wheaton arts and cultural center in Millville. This is a museum of American glass which celebrates the creativity and craftsmanship of American manufacturing. In 1739 New Jersey defied the British who wanted to manufacture and market glassware to America with American raw materials. The museum housed many beautiful examples of American glassware. The village also had a glass blowing exhibit and pottery making.

On Saturday morning we visited the NAS Wildwood Aviation museum. This airplane hangar was assembled in 1942 by the government for a naval air training base. The base trained dive bomber pilots who fought in the Pacific theater in 1943-1945. The museum housed many vintage airplanes, helicopters, cars, and even an original air traffic control tower from Atlantic City. Our lunch was at the nearby Flight Deck Diner. In the afternoon we toured Cold Spring Village which houses many re-located 18th and 19th century buildings. The buildings had furnishings, tools, and implements from the past. Our tour guide was very knowledgeable about this time period. After the tour some folks walked to the on site Cold Spring brewery for a free beer sample.

On Sunday morning we went to the Cape May Zoo. This is a well kept small zoo with about 250 species. In the afternoon we boarded the Cape May trolley for a tour past many of the beautiful old Victorian houses. Cape May is America's first seaside resort- also learned that whaling was a big industry there in the 1800's. We also toured an 18 room Victorian house with period architecture and furnishings. We did get a brief glimpse of the ocean and sand dunes on the trolley tour.

On Monday morning we drove through the Forsythe wildlife refuge near Atlantic City. This area provides life saving food for migratory birds. The only birds we saw were some wild ducks. Before heading home we stopped at an antique mall and the Smithville village green

shopping center. After lunch we again drove the backroads to eventually cross the Delaware at New Hope and head home. I didn't mention the meals- the trip lived up to our reputation about having plenty of good food on these trips. Somehow Ken and Elsa found many great diners in N.J. However these diners seem to serve more food in their dinners than even in Berks County! Everyone began to think "must we eat again" and what will the scale say back home!

Thanks to Ken and Elsa for a well planned and successful tour. We didn't lose anyone in the pine barrens and I think everyone had a great time.
