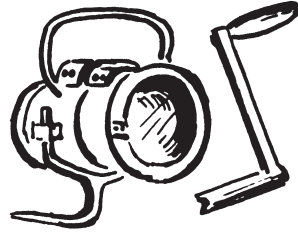
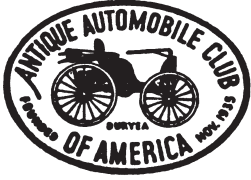

SEPTEMBER MEETING MINUTES

Susan Manwiller gave the Secretary's report from the business meeting held May 4, 2024. There was one correction, the date for Strausstown Car Show should be September 8, 2024. A motion to accept the Secretary's report was made by Elaine Baer and seconded by Bob Hobaugh. The motion carried unanimously.

Lester Manwiller gave the Treasurer's report for May, June, July and August. There was a question concerning multiple entries for interest income. Lester explained that interest amounts were for multiple CD's. A motion to approve the treasurer's report, subject to audit, was made by Shirley Schaffer and seconded by Mike Wolfe. The motion carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership: Phyllis Peters reported that membership remained the same. National membership dues notice will appear as an insert in your AACA magazine. AACA dues are due by the end of the year. Ontelaunee dues can be paid at any function where you see Phyllis.

Newsletter: Barbara Koch asked that anyone sending any articles to Mike Horning, please call him the following day to make sure he received it. Mike prefers articles be sent in the body of an email; however, you can send it as an attachment and he will forward it to the printer.

Activities: Suzy McGovern reported we need a tour master for the Applejack & Cider Tour.

1. Four-Day Tour, September 13-16, 2024 – Ken Dages has been in contact with the places we are going to. Everything is all set.
2. Fall Foliage Tour, October 20, 2024 – Tour masters are Cheri & Jeff Dotterer. They are planning a poker run. We will meet here at the church and Jeff will give a poker card at each stop. There will be ample parking at each stop and stop 4 will have rest rooms. The hayride at Duncan Corn Maze starts at 2:15, members are asked to bring a covered dish, hot dogs and drinks are provided. Let Cheri know what covered dish you will be bringing.
3. Applejack & Cider Tour – Open

Leesport Swap Meet: Lester reported the contract with the Leesport Farmers Market has been signed. There is no fee from the township if we charge admission. Jeff said we will be charging admission to everyone as they drive in. We will need two crews to collect \$3.00 per person. He feels we will need 6 to 8 people from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. He will bring a sign-up sheet next month. If anyone asks, the money we collect from spectators pays for the rental of the facility.

Phyllis mentioned there should be a sign to encourage people to go into the building. Ray Huber asked how to tell who is a vendor. They will have a copy of their vendor registration. Those who say they will be helping at a vendor stand should know who they are helping and can be left in.

Das Awkscht Fescht: Chairman Bob Hobaugh reported the following:

1. We did a great job considering the heat and rain.
2. We had good celebrities.
3. Did not have a hot air balloon.
4. Bob had photographers who took over 6000 pictures and put them on thumb drives. Bob is looking for volunteers to go through the pictures and pick good ones to put on our website.
5. Next year, pictures can be taken to be sold to owners.
6. Lehigh Valley Camaro Club will host the feature car.
7. Bob is trying to get people who raced Camaros in the 60's as speakers.
8. New this year were painted lines on the show field and the use of pool noodles for spacing of cars.
9. This year we also had volunteers assisting car clubs with parking. Clubs are still responsible for parking their own cars but our volunteers will park cars until their parker shows up.
10. Next year the Toy Show will be in the park. It will be where the barbecue had been years ago in the field near the bandshell.
11. Workers party for anyone who helped at the Fescht is Friday, October 11 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
12. The Secretary reported 17 cars in the car corral this year. There were 55 cars that registered day-of-show bringing the total cars to 1713 for three days and 209 flea market spaces sold. Due to excessive heat no-shows were greater that last year.

REPORT ON THE DOG DAYS TOUR

On the morning of Sunday, August 18th we met at Weis Market on Route 100 North in Fogelsville for the Dog Days Tour. Because the day was overcast and drizzly, many tour members did not drive their antique/classic cars.

Tim and Sue Hinkle lead a lovely tour of Lehigh and Northampton Counties. We traveled numerous back roads that showcased the more rural areas of the counties. A delicious lunch was served to everyone at Rudy's Bar and Grill in Bethlehem.

After lunch, Barbara Koch and Florita Hobaugh arranged for a tour at The National Museum of Industrial History. It is located in the old Bethlehem Steel plant area. This was a very interesting museum. The first exhibit was of the advancements of the American home after World War II through the 1970's. Displayed in a "mock" home were many items we remembered growing up with and/or living with. Some items were the one door refrigerator with the inside freezer compartment, the old wall phone that you had to use your finger to turn the dial, a formica table, an all metal stroller (Jack Legath remembered this from his youth), etc.

The great hall was divided into 4 areas that showcased American industrial history. The first area was Machinery. This consisted of machinery displayed at the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial in Philadelphia. The second area was Iron and Steel. Here was where we saw the importance of the steel making industry in America. Next was Silk and Textiles. The Docent explained how not only men, but women and children worked in the textile industry. On display here is a Jacquard loom threaded with hundreds of threads and the punch card weaving patterns that wove material for the White House's window treatments and furniture. Last was Propane and Energy. This showcased how significant propane has been as a source of energy.

Criteria: (As was originally established in 2005) Any student beginning his/her second year of education beyond high school or vocational school, to attend a college or trade school of their choice will be considered for Education Monies from the Ontelaunee Region. The same student may be considered for a grant in his/her third or fourth year, if they did not receive any past grants or there are no other candidates applying for the money in their second year. The determination shall be made by the Education Committee at the time the application is received. Any child, grandchild, or great-grandchild of an active member of the Ontelaunee Region may apply for this education money. Maximum award is \$500 per applicant.
